Origin of E-grants Initiative – Grants.gov


- Grants.gov was established in 2002 as part of the President's management agenda to improve services to the public as a Governmental Resource - E-grants Initiative, started with Public Law 106-107 which:
 - Improved the effectiveness and performance of federal grant programs
 - Simplified grant application and reporting requirements
 - Initiative cuts across agencies, and is designed to reduce the differences that exist between programs of similar purpose
 - Now the federal government's single site for grant-making agencies to publish grant funding opportunities and application packages online
 - Enables the grant community, to search for grant opportunities, download, complete and electronically submit applications for the over **\$500 billion worth of awards distributed annually**

- There is no cost to apply for a grant on the site
- If you are seeking personal financial assistance, there are many federal resources available, visit the "Recovery Act Money and You" page:

- The "Recovery Money and You" page is the second link listed, it's an additional resource to find other opportunities related to the Recovery Act funds not related to Grants.gov
- The White House Web site is also listed as additional resource for Recovery Act information
- And finally a listing of "Upcoming Webinars" can be accessed by clicking on the "Upcoming Webinars" button.

Left Navigation Bar

- Applicant information is available under the **For Applicants** section in the left navigation, applicants can use the left navigation to:

- You can sign-up for alerts on system enhancements, status and other up to the minute information






All Recovery Act Opportunities

- A listing of all Recovery Act Opportunities is available from the Recovery Act feature on the homepage
 - Click the yellow button “Recovery Act Grant Opportunities”

Search Features on Left Navigation Bar

There are multiple ways to search for grant opportunities, including Basic Search, Browse By Category, Browse By Agency and Advanced Search

- Basic Search** allows you to enter keywords, a Funding Opportunity Number (FON) or CFDA (Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance) Number specific to a particular opportunity
- Browse by Category**, provides a listing of different categories to choose from, there is a Recovery category that brings you back to the full listing of Recovery Act opportunities (screen shown)
- Browse by Agency**, if you are looking for opportunities from a specific grantor agency, you can select the agency from the list
- Advanced Search** helps you narrow your search criteria and manage the type of opportunity results displayed for your search, which we will discuss further

SELECT A RECOVERY ACT GRANT OPPORTUNITY – SEARCH RESULTS

Recovery Act Search Results

- Once your search query has been entered you receive a **Search Results** screen (similar to screen displayed, depending on the search criteria)
- Ensure you read the synopsis for the opportunity
 - The program may encompass more funding areas than what the title of the opportunity implies
- To read the **Synopsis** click on the “**Opportunity Title**” which is a hyperlink

Sorting Your Search Query Results

- You may sort your search query results in ascending or descending order by the column headings:
 - **Close Date**
 - **Opportunity Title**
 - **Agency**

• Click on the opportunity of interest to you to view the synopsis and determine whether the opportunity is right for you

– Grants.gov maintains closed opportunities on the site as a resource for the applicant community since some grant opportunities are posted in each fiscal year with some adjustments

Synopsis

- The opportunity synopsis is summary of grant information from the entire grant opportunity
- Some of the most important information to the applicant is found in the synopsis, such as information on:
 - Category of Funding Activity
 - Estimated Total Program Funding
 - Award Ceiling
- You may access the **Full Announcement** and **Application package** by using the buttons at the top of the synopsis screen
 - Full Announcement shows as the name implies the full announcement and other information the granting agency deems relevant to the funding opportunity
 - A downloadable application package is accessible by clicking on **Application** button
- You can **search for grant opportunities** (download and fill-in a grant application package) **before you register** with Grants.gov; however you **must be registered to submit** a grant application package
 - Registration will be discussed in-depth during “Series 3: Recovery Act Money and You – Get Registered to Apply for Recovery Act Opportunities”

Purpose: This NIH Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA), supported by funds provided to the NIH under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Recovery Act or RRA), Public Law 111-5, invites grant applications from small business concerns that propose to accelerate innovation through high risk, high reward research and development (R and D) that has commercial potential and is relevant to the mission of the NIH. The Small Business Catalyst Award is further expected to support entrepreneurs of exceptional creativity, drawn from scientific and technological environments beyond NIH, who propose pioneering and possibly transformative approaches to addressing major biomedical or behavioral challenges with the potential for downstream commercial development. The Small Business Catalyst Award for Accelerating Innovative Research funding opportunity seeks to encourage fresh research perspectives and approaches to serve the mission of NIH. In particular, applications from small business concerns without a history of NIH Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) or Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) support may receive funding priority. Subjects are applications for support for projects that have the potential to generate high impact results (e.g., products, processes or services) and/or innovative research applications, research tools, techniques, devices, inventions, or methodologies. The outcomes of the research supported should have potential to lead to products that will improve public health and create significant value and economic stimulus. This FOA solicits early-stage ideas that promise to lead to major leaps forward in capabilities important to serving the mission of NIH rather than incremental improvements of existing technologies. In accord with the funding priority of this initiative to attract applicants without a history of SBIR/STTR support from NIH, the focus of the projects solicited by this FOA is on early stage technology development.

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

Synopsis Cont.

- As you scroll down the synopsis page you will see more information about the opportunity such as:
 - Eligible Applicants
 - Additional Information on Eligibility
 - Agency Name
 - Opportunity Description
- Synopsis offers a written description of the grant, you can see a brief write up below
 - The written description helps you determine if this is the proper opportunity for you

Important Note: if you have questions regarding the grant opportunity itself you will need to contact the Agency PoC listed on the opportunity and NOT Grants.gov

- Since there are over 2000 grant programs listed on the site Grants.gov (not versed on specific opportunities)



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FORMULA AND BLOCK GRANTS - CATALOG OF FEDERAL DOMESTIC ASSISTANCE

Formula and Block Grants on Grants.gov

- There are few formula/ block grants available on Grants.gov (OSHA – Occupational Safety and Health Administration – post formula to Grants.gov)
- The majority of the grants on Grants.gov are discretionary grants

Discretionary Grants

- A grant for which the federal grantor agency generally may select the recipient from among all eligible recipients
- The federal grantor agency may decide to make or not make an award based on the programmatic, technical or scientific content of an application
- The federal grantor agency can also decide the amount of funding to be awarded

Mandatory Grants (Formula/ Block)

- This type of funding is generally distributed to the states (although this may vary based on the agency)
- Grants awarded to eligible entities through allocation based on the program's authorizing legislation
- Block grants are a type of formula grant and tend to have only general provisions as to the way it is to be spent in comparison to a regular formula grant
- A **formula grant** is a US federal grant specifying a precise formula in the legislation creating the program
- Formula Grants include quantifiable elements, for example (*this varies*):
 - Population
 - Amount of tax effort
 - Proportion of population unemployed or below poverty level
 - Density of housing
 - Or rate of infant mortality
- Specified formula is a rule that tells potential recipient governments precisely how they can calculate the quantity of aid to which they are entitled under the provisions of law (as long as the recipient qualifies for such assistance under the stipulations of the program)
- Generally the formulas are chosen to reflect characteristics related to the purpose of the grant

Examples of Agencies that offer Formula/Block Grants

- Department of Housing and Urban Development (Office Of Community Planning And Development)
 - Community Development Block Grants/Brownfields Economic Development Initiative (14.228)
- Department of Commerce National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) - Habitat Conservation
 - Recovery Act opportunity - To provide grants and cooperative agreements for habitat conservation activities including coastal and marine habitat restoration and protection
- OSHA – Occupational Safety and Health Administration

How to Find Formula/Block Grants

- Contact the agency directly to determine where formula and block grant funds were allocated and which programs will be funded
 - Some federal agencies do not offer formula or block grants (i.e. NIH)
- The grantor agency point of contact for formula and block grants will be able to give you information on finding additional resources to apply for these funds

Visit the CFDA website at CFDA.gov

- You may also visit the CFDA website at CFDA.gov to search for Formula/ Block grants using their advanced search (shown on screen)
- Enter a keyword to do a "Full Text Search" if you are not sure of the exact name of the opportunity
 - a search by CFDA number may be done from the search box on the right side of the CFDA homepage
- Select Assistance Type – Formula Grants
- Select your Eligibility (Individual/ Family shown on screen)
- Scroll down the page to select Recovery Act Specific opportunities

Note: Federal agencies have identified over 200 new and existing CFDA programs funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Recovery Act or ARRA). There are only 174 Recovery Act-funded CFDA programs currently published on the CFDA web site.
